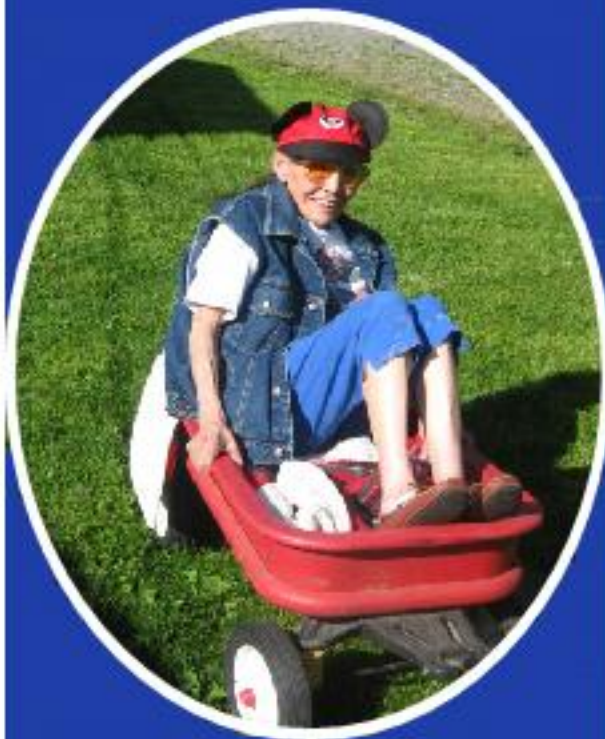


**You Will Always
